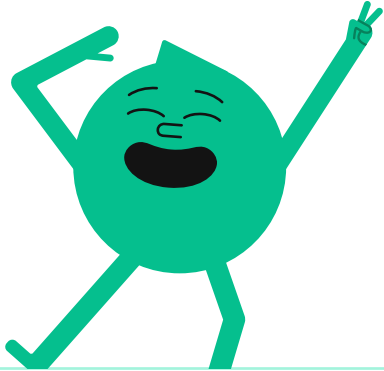


# Reading challenge: read to succeed

**Make a meal from a cookbook.**

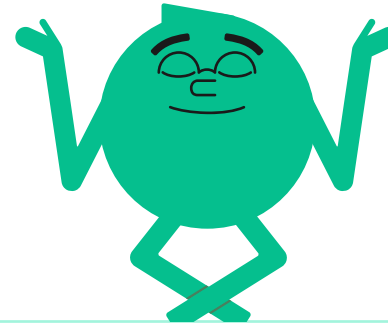


**Play a board game that involves reading.**

## Play an improv game.

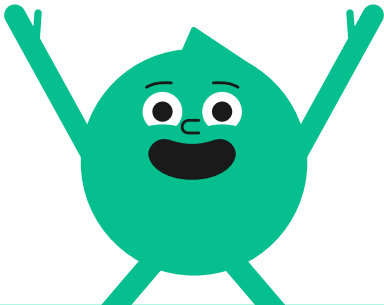
Act out amusing scenarios drawn from a hat.
