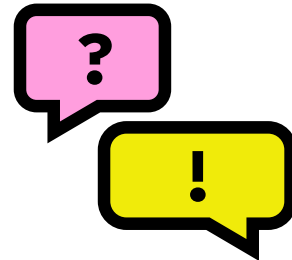


# Conversation starters

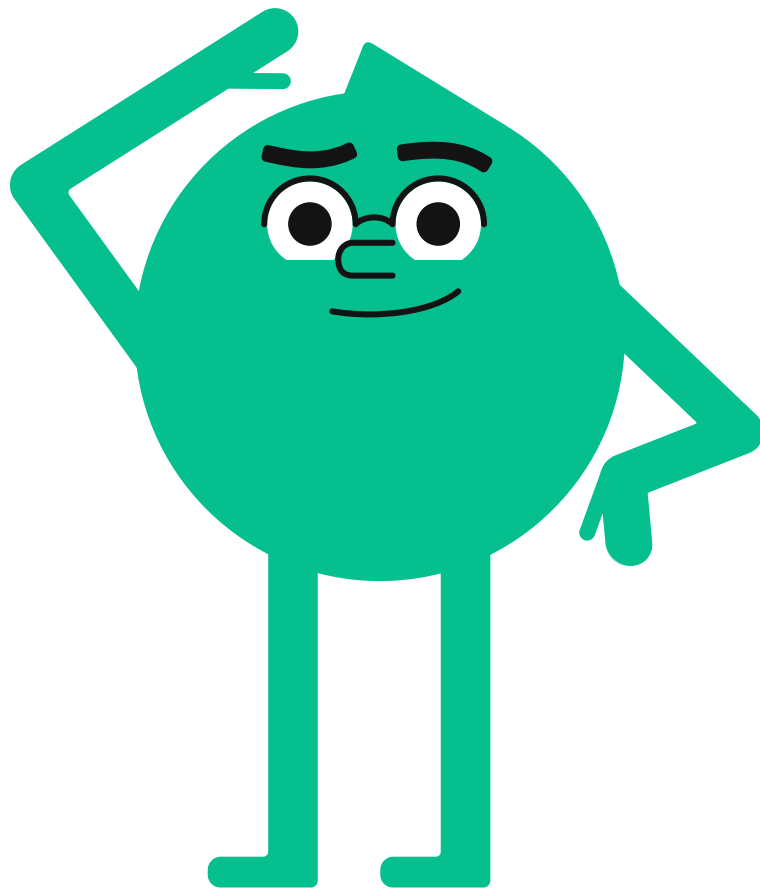
Expressing an opinion without casting judgment isn't always easy! This game is designed to help your child learn to voice their opinions while staying open to other points of view.
