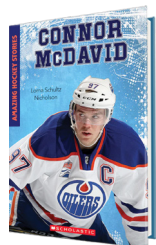


QUI ES-TU AGATHA CHRISTIE? (FRENCH ONLY)

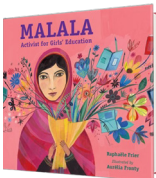


CONNOR MCDAVID

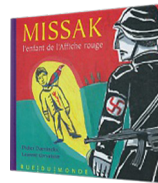


JANE GOODALL

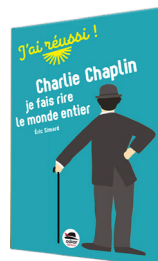


MISSAK, L'ENFANT SUR L'AFFICHE ROUGE (FRENCH ONLY)
