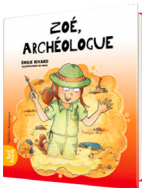

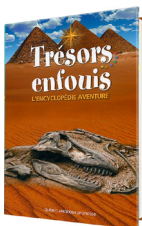
In Ms. Isabelle's class, each student gets to choose a character they'll embody for a particular adventure. Zoé wants to be an archaeologist...
