

Wheel of Sentence Types



This fun and creative activity is a great way to practise working with the four sentence types.

Warning: May cause laughter!

Assembly Instructions

- Print out the following pages.
- Cut out the wheel and arrow.
- Glue the wheel to a piece of cardboard or cardstock for extra durability (*optional*).
- Attach the arrow with a paper fastener.
- Cut out the sentences and put them in a bowl.



How to Play

1. Draw a sentence from the bowl and read it aloud.
2. Identify the sentence type (declarative, imperative, interrogative, or exclamatory).
3. Spin the arrow.
4. Rephrase the sentence to match the sentence type you spun.
5. If the arrow lands on the same sentence type as the original sentence, you have two options:
 - a. Spin again.
 - b. Use your imagination to come up with a new sentence that continues the idea in the first sentence. You can choose any sentence type you want, but you have to correctly identify it!
6. Check with your teammates to see whether your sentence is in the right category.
7. Your turn is over, and it's time for the next person to play.



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Example 1

Sentence drawn: Let the cat sleep on the couch.
(imperative sentence)

Sentence type spun: Interrogative sentence

Possible answer: Should we let the cat sleep on the couch?

Example 2

Sentence drawn: They're so lucky to be travelling to Italy!
(exclamatory sentence)

Sentence type spun: Exclamatory sentence.

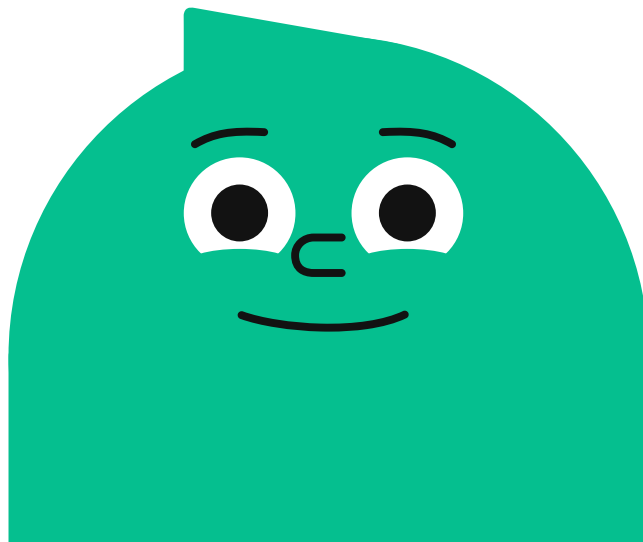
You can either spin again or choose any sentence type you want and come up with a sentence that continues the original idea.

For example:

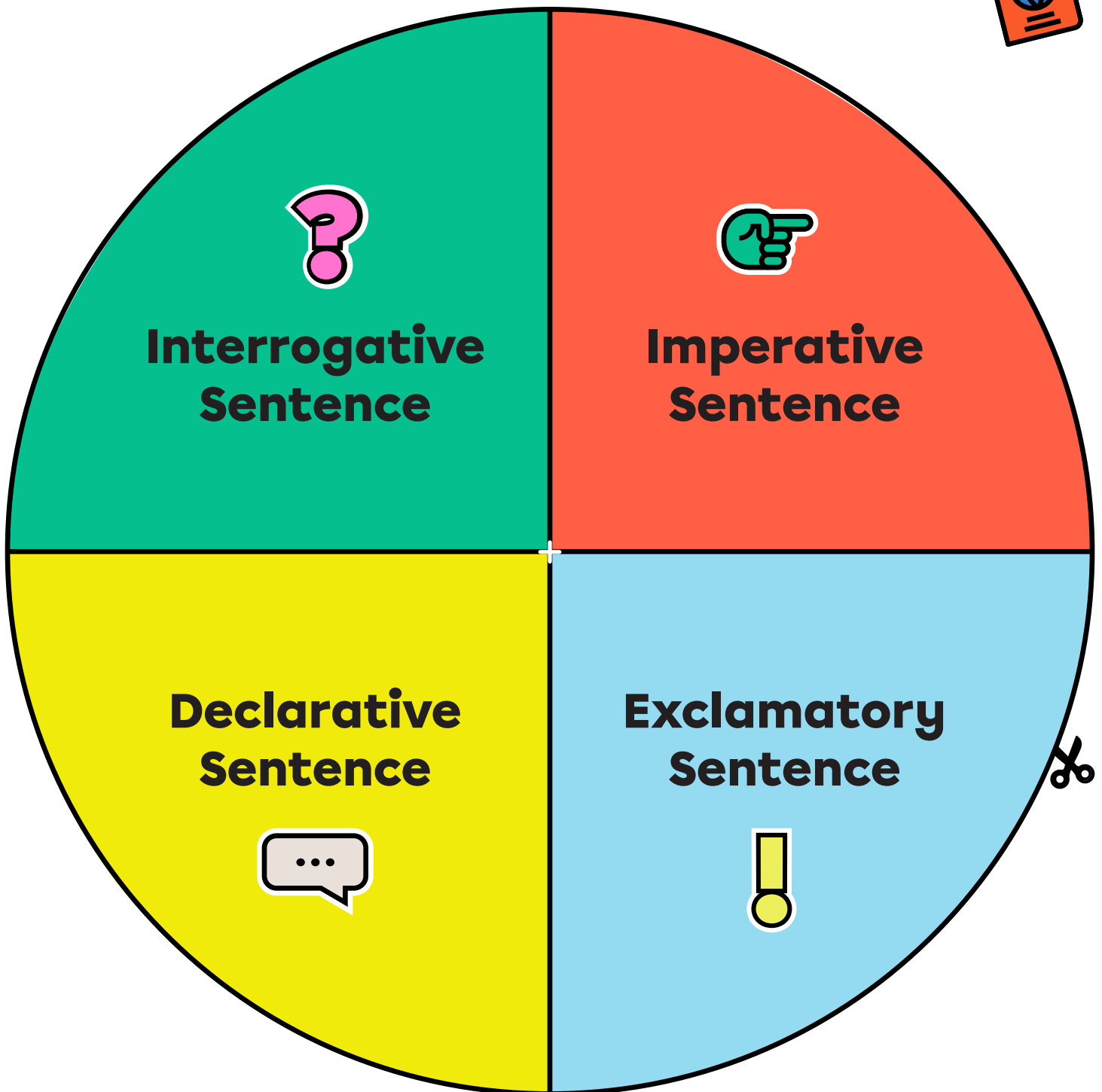
How impressive the city of Venice seems!
(exclamatory sentence)

OR

They'll be able to visit the Leaning Tower of Pisa and eat pizza.
(declarative sentence)



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We're going to the theatre tonight.	This recipe is so delicious!
Why do leaves fall in autumn?	Look both ways before crossing the street.
What a surprise to see you here!	How did your test go?
Clean your room before you go out.	The book was sitting on the table.
The kids are playing in the park.	What time does the library close?
Who turned off the lights in the kitchen?	What a lovely gift!
The cat is sleeping under the table.	They're baking a cake for your party.
What a small world!	Water the flowers in the garden.
Don't forget to say thank you.	Will the train arrive on time?
What a shame the party's over!	The test was hard.
Add three eggs to the recipe.	Help your brother with his homework.
How much does this hat cost?	The ocean is calm today.
He scored a great goal!	Remember to close the door when you leave.
The stars are so bright tonight!	When does the hockey game start?
She won first prize in the competition.	Be quiet in the library.
Can we go to the movies tomorrow?	You've gotten so tall since the last time I saw you!



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
