### **Activity Summary**

#### Introduction

The school's **drama club\*** is organizing a play and has assigned students different tasks to help make it happen.

\*drama club : A club at a school where students learn about acting and theater

Your task is to put costumes together with the assistance of Plunkett's Costume Department.

You each have 4 costumes to prepare for extras in the final scene of the play. The story isn't complete yet, so you don't know what the scene is about. The only directive you were given is to try and get 4 varied costumes, avoid looks that are too similar.

#### Part 1 – Pick & Find the Right Words

#### Part 2 – Describe the Costumes & Bring Them to Rehearsal\*

\*rehearsal : A practice session for a play, musical, or performance.

In turn, you will play 2 roles:

- 1. Student preparing costumes
- 2. Clerk\* at Plunkett's Costume Department

clerk: A worker who performs a variety of administrative tasks such as answering calls, maintaining records, managing material or providing information

Roles	What to do
Student preparing costumes	<ol> <li>Describe the chosen costumes using the vocabulary noted down in Task. Describe one costume at a time.</li> </ol>
	<ol><li>Look at the proposed costume and say if it is the one you wanted or not.</li></ol>
	<ol><li>Give more information when asked for it or repeat description if necessary.</li></ol>
	<ol> <li>Note down how many tries were necessary to find the right costume.</li> </ol>
	5. When the right costume is found, switch roles with the other student.w
Clerk at Plunkett's	1. Listen to the descriptions.
Costume Department	<ol> <li>Find the matching costumes on the Character Look References page with the information given.</li> <li>*Do not ask any questions yet.</li> </ol>
	<ol> <li>When you think you have found the right costume, point to it on your Character Look References page and ask the question: "Is this it?"</li> </ol>
	<ol><li>If the answer is "yes," the costume is found and you switch roles with the other student.</li></ol>
	5. If the answer is "No," you ask the student for more information and details or to repeat the description. And go back to Step 2.


Repeat until all costumes are found for each student.


